Joanna looks back at the autumn programme.....

The new programme opened in September with a fascinating talk given by William Whyte Professor of architectural history at St John's College. (and former Curate of St Mary's) He told us the story of our 800 year old Church. It was an intriguing tale and now as we look around at the different parts of the building we can imagine the Nave with a gallery high above us and the beautiful woodwork on the choir stalls salvaged from the ruins of Osney Abbey. In October we were enchanted by the first public readings ever of the love letters written 250 years ago between John Constable and his wife Maria. James Hamilton, resident under the spire of St Mary's, edited and reduced around 1000 letters. They were beautifully read by his wife, Kate Eustace, Shirley Steventon and accompanied on the organ by Philip Towler.

At the end of November ancient folk songs about love, war & nature were sung in English and Zulu by Oli Steadman who was one of the Founder members of the Oxford band Stornoway that has had great success round the world and in 24 hours filled the 6000 seats for a concert in The Royal Albert Hall next March. It was Oli's first solo gig and we learned about his passion for conservation, for wildflowers and his two year old daughter Merry who clearly also enjoyed his singing and playing of the 'Zulu squeeze box' as well as the guitar and mouthorgan.
